State Board issues eight licenses: three manufacturers, five contractors

CHARLESTON – The state's factory-built housing regulatory board issued three manufacturer licenses and approved licenses for five contractors during a teleconference Wednesday in Charleston.

The Manufactured Housing Construction and Safety Standards Board was chaired for the first time by newly named Deputy Labor Commissioner John Junkins Jr.

Manufacturer licenses were unanimously approved for Crest Homes of Elkhart, IN; Fleetwood Homes, Inc., of Rocky Mount, VA; and Fleetwood Homes, Inc., of Lafayette, TN.

Contractor licenses were issued to: Randolph HVAC of Red House, Putnam County; H&L Construction of Lexington, TN; Jeffrey W. Loftin, doing business as Custom Transporting & Evacuation, of Belington, Barbour County; Appalachian Mobile Homes, Inc., of Princeton, which was a former retail dealer but is now a contractor; and CH2M Hill Constructors, Inc., of Englewood, CO.

Manufacturer housing section chief Mitch Woodrum said H&L and CH2M have been licensed to do Federal Emergency Management Agency work in areas flooded earlier this year in southern West Virginia.

The State Board's next meeting is 10 a.m. Sept. 24 in Charleston.
